## The following safety information has been reviewed with the trainee:

- $\Box$  No extra rider policy. Never allow an extra rider if a seat and seat belt is not available.
- $\Box$  Tractors should only be started while the operator is sitting in the seat.
- $\Box$  Potential locations for tractor overturns on the site the tractor will be used.
- $\Box$  PTO safety:
  - 1. Dress safely (close fitting clothing, remove hood strings, tie long hair back, etc.)
  - 2. Keep all PTO shielding in place and operating properly.
  - 3. Never step or lean over a PTO shaft. Always walk around the tractor and implement.
  - 4. When making repairs or adjustments, first shut off the PTO, the tractor engine, and wait for everything to come to a complete stop.
